You can help those arms spread across the United States by sharing your ideas, projects, pictures and successes with us. Remember, it only takes one person to mentor, encourage or do something with a youth to get the youth interested in the fun and joy of gardening.

In 2014, the Octopus Outreach began. This is a program in which any member of any club or members-at-large can recognize any youth who is doing something involving gardening or gardening-related activities, either in progress or completed.

Use the form on the Youth Gardening web pages for Octopus Outreach with Recognition. Carry the form with you when you go to flower shows, fairs, gardens, 4-H and Scout events, etc., and be on the lookout for some youth participants. You might even find a youth right in your neighborhood, or a co-worker's, relative's or friend's child who you could recognize.

When you find a youth, fill out the form with them and send it to Cheri Kessen. On the first line, put your name and the name of your club. On the second line, put a brief description of the project. On the third line, put the place, show or activity where you discovered your young gardener-to-be.

Take a photo of the project or activity with the youth. Be sure to get the signed and dated permission by the responsible adult and make sure the youth's name, email and address are legible.

You may send in as many forms as you like at any time of the year. The youth will receive a paper recognition certificate from TGOA with words of encouragement to keep up the good work.

This is not a contest; there is no judging – just recognition. It is a year-round activity.
